

Kevin Bower Receives FIE Fellowship

The Frontiers in Education (FIE) Conference is held annually in the fall and jointly sponsored by the Education, Research, and Methods Division of ASEE; IEEE Education Society; and the IEEE Computer Society. Each year FIE invites new engineering and computer science faculty to submit applications for possible selection as New Faculty Fellows. Fellows are chosen based on their conference paper; a nomination letter from the department chair, dean, or dissertation chair; and an applicant-resume. A rigorous peer-reviewed application process is used, with a review panel of engineering and computer science faculty from assistant, associate, and full professor levels. The application process is extremely competitive. This year, the committee chose to award 9 fellowships from an initial group of over 40 applicants. Dr. Kevin Bower, Assistant Professor in Civil and Environmental Engineering, was one of the nine faculty members receiving this honor.



New Faculty Fellows participate in a special “Focus on New Faculty Fellows” event that displays posters describing their interests and activities and previews of the full papers they will present as part of the FIE 2004 technical sessions. The fellowship also includes a monetary award.
